KCR TURNS SILVER JUBILEE INTO A POLITICAL BROADSIDE

At the BRS Silver Jubilee Plenary, KCR chose attack over nostalgia, targeting both Congress and BJP while raising Telangana pride as a central political plank. The speech signalled a clear shift from introspection to confrontation, with Congress responding almost instantly, setting the stage for an intense political slugfest.

At Telangana Bhavan, the 25-year milestone of the Bharat Rashtra Samithi was expected to be a moment of reflection. Instead, K. Chandrashekar Rao used the occasion to send out a sharp, unambiguous political signal. This was not about looking back. This was about reclaiming space. KCR's language was blunt, his intent unmistakable. By going after the Congress government in such direct terms, he was clearly speaking not just to political rivals but to his own cadre, reassuring them that the fight is far from over.

THE TRIGGER: PARLIAMENT AND PRIDE

The immediate spark came from remarks made by Tejasvi Surya, and K. Chandrashekar Rao used that moment to launch a direct and unsparring political attack. He branded the current Telangana Congress government as "chandalam" and "chillara," questioning both its credibility and seriousness. Turning sharply to the Parliament episode, he said, "Tejasvi Surya is a fool. If our BRS MPs were in Parliament, we would have turned it into a battleground for Telangana's dignity and self respect." He then widened the charge to what he described as a complete failure of response from existing representatives, adding, "The absence of BRS was clearly felt."

Not a single person stopped him or responded. If anyone speaks carelessly about Telangana, are Congress and BJP leaders not answerable? KCR framed those comments as an affront to Telangana's identity, and then widened the argument, asking why there was no effective pushback in Parliament. It was a clever political move. By invoking

Telangana pride, KCR placed both Congress and BJP in the same frame, suggesting a shared failure to defend the state's interests. Whether that argument holds politically is another matter, but as messaging, it was sharp and targeted.

THE MESSAGE FROM TELANGANA BHAVAN

Not a commemorative speech. A calibrated political comeback. A signal to cadre: stay battle-ready

CONGRESS HITS BACK: REVENTH REDDY'S DIRECT COUNTER

The Congress response was swift, pointed, and unapologetically combative, with Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy taking on K. Chandrashekar Rao line by line. He pushed back on the Parliament charge, asking, "Did KCR not see our MPs speaking in Parliament? Can't these BRS fools see?" while referring to interventions made by Congress MP Kavaya in the House. Raising the political stakes, he went further with a direct challenge: "Can KCR take oath that he didn't speak to BJP?" He accused the BRS leadership of "distorting facts and misleading people," alleging that the outrage being projected was selective and built on false narratives. Even as the tone remained sharp, he sought to frame the exchange as a question of standards, calling for "responsible politics" instead of escalating rhetoric. The rebuttal travelled quickly across platforms, shaping itself into a structured counter to KCR's claims and ensuring that the narrative did not remain one-sided.

BEYOND RHETORIC: FARMERS AND KALESHWARAM

K. Chandrashekar Rao moved beyond pure political attack to stitch together memory, grievance, and governance, using Kaleshwaram and farmer distress as his central pillars. Referring to criticism from Union Minister CR Patil, he pointed out that BRS voices had already pushed back, noting that Suresh Reddy "strongly condemned it in Rajya Sabha." He then turned reflective, saying, "On many occasions, they caused me immense mental anguish, but our resolve for Telangana never changed," invoking the long struggle for statehood and recalling the 2009 TDP alliance with N Chandrababu Naidu that advanced the "Jai Telangana" movement. Positioning his own policy legacy, he added that Rythu Bandhu was introduced on the advice of economist Ashok Gulati, framing it as a considered intervention rather than political improvisation. But the sharpest edge came on present conditions, where he alleged a deepening agrarian crisis, stating that farmers are suffering due to failed procurement, and that the broader public mood has collapsed, describing it as the public is in distress. He even flagged symbolic governance lapses, pointing out that the gates of the Ambedkar statue remain shut to visitors from neighbouring states. The thread running through his argument was clear: combine emotional recall with administrative critique, and reclaim Kaleshwaram as a benchmark of the BRS development model now under challenge.

THE ORGANISATIONAL RESET

Perhaps the most significant takeaway was not the rhetoric but the restructuring. By dissolving party committees and assigning responsibilities to K. T. Rama Rao, KCR has initiated a reset within the party. This suggests a more centralised and

disciplined approach going forward, with an emphasis on training and cadre mobilisation. It's a sign that BRS is preparing for a longer political battle, not just immediate optics.

THE LARGER POLITICAL CONTEXT

What we saw today is part of a broader churn in Telangana politics. KCR is attempting to move from a phase of relative quiet to one of active engagement. Congress, on the other hand, is asserting itself as the governing force and pushing back against every challenge. BJP remains a factor, even when not immediately vocal. This triangular contest is only likely to intensify.

KTR'S ROLE: MORE THAN JUST SUPPORTING CAST

KTR's speech reinforced the central line — criticising both Congress and BJP while projecting confidence about the future. But more importantly, his growing organisational role indicates a gradual shift in how BRS is structuring its leadership for the next phase. The message is subtle but significant:

RESET, RESPONSE, AND A RISING POLITICAL TEMPERATURE

KCR's silver jubilee speech was less about celebration and more about recalibration. It signals that BRS is ready to re-enter the political arena with sharper edges and clearer intent. But the response it has already triggered shows that the road ahead will be anything but easy. Telangana politics is heating up again, and this was just the opening exchange.

KTR Responds on Kavitha's New Party- Says many parties will come and go

HYDERABAD

BRS party working president KTR has responded regarding his sister Kavitha's new political party. Making an indirect reference to the 'Telangana Rashtra Sena' (TRS), he remarked that many parties come and go. He stated that very few parties manage to complete 25 years of existence, implying that there is no need to pay much attention to a new party. "Many people are talking about KCR and there is no need to pay them any heed. We held discussions regarding the welfare schemes implemented for Singareni workers. We passed a resolution expressing gratitude to all sections of society and the entire populace of Telangana. Another resolution was passed to thank those, who cooperated during the statehood movement and walked alongside us. During the meeting, we also took decisions concerning the chaotic administration of the Congress party. The United Nations has praised our 'Rythu Bandhu' scheme for the support it provides to farmers. However, the Congress government is currently undermining the Rythu Bandhu scheme. They



are distributing funds to farmers in installments merely to engage in self-promotion," he said.

KTR revealed that they held extensive discussions regarding the crisis prevailing in the state's agricultural sector. He claimed that Farmers were suffering losses due to the state government's negligence in grain procurement and added that the Grain stocks had fallen into the hands of middlemen and added that procurement centers across the state were non-functional. "We passed a resolution demanding that the government procure the grains without imposing any restrictions. If the government fails to procure the grains without such restrictions, the BRS will launch a protest movement in the villages," he asserted.

Agriculture Inputs Merchants Association holds state-wide Bandh

Responding to a call issued by the All-India and State-level associations, a one-day complete state wide shutdown (Bandh) was successfully observed by the Agriculture Inputs Merchants Association on Monday. Organized under the leadership of the Telangana State President Nagurla Venkateshwarlu, the shutdown aimed to address and resolve the various issues faced by dealers of fertilizers, pesticides and seeds. The Dealers from all districts, mandals and villages across Telangana State voluntarily participated in this shutdown to express their solidarity. Under the aegis of the Hyderabad Agriculture Inputs Merchants Association, all shops dealing in fertilizers, pesticides and seeds remained completely closed. On this occasion, the Association urged the state government to respond immediately and take appropriate action regarding the key issues currently confronting the dealers. These issues include FOL (Fertilizer on Link)-related problems, mandatory 'link products,' the need for increased dealer margins.

KCR lashes out at BJP MP's reckless remarks on Telangana formation

BRS president and former chief minister K. Chandrashekar Rao has lashed out at Karnataka BJP MP Tejasvi Surya for speaking recklessly regarding the formation of Telangana state.

He warned that while the Congress and BJP MPs remained silent on the comments made by Surya, had BRS MPs been present in the Lok Sabha, they would have created a "battlefield" in protest.

The BRS president recalled that when Union Jal Shakti Minister C.R. Patil spoke about the Kaleshwaram project in the Rajya Sabha, the BRS party floor leader Suresh Reddy had strongly condemned it.

Addressing the state party executive committee meeting at Telangana Bhavan in Hyderabad on Monday, Chandrashekar Rao questioned as to what the Telangana Congress and BJP leaders were doing while a BJP MP spoke disparagingly about Telangana?

Noting that he had been subjected to immense mental anguish by many people on numerous occasions, KCR recalled that the Congress leader Sonia Gandhi had repeat-

edly told him to compromise on the issue of Hyderabad. He clarified that despite Sonia Gandhi's repeated insistence, he refused to compromise—a testament to his unwavering integrity.

He urged the party leaders to engage in self-inspection to understand as to why they suffered defeat, despite having implemented so many welfare programmes for the people?

Reiterating the need for self-criticism to understand as to why they lost despite having a membership base of 60 lakhs, the BRS chief emphasised that quality—not quantity—was what truly matters.

KCR observed that despite having done everything possible for the Singareni workers, the party suffered a defeat in coal belt region. He alleged that the Congress party leaders were currently engaging in illegal activities and land encroachments.

He expressed optimism that the people, having grown weary of the current situation, would ensure a victory for the BRS party in the upcoming elections.

Chandrashekar Rao lashed out at the State government, stating that the plight of the farmers in Telangana had

deteriorated and that the current administration was incapable of procuring grain.

He remarked that it was baffling to understand as what was actually transpiring within the state.

Expressing that the people of Telangana are distressed, he lambasted the administration, labeling it as a "petty government" and questioning the nature of its rhetoric. KCR fumed that the Congress leaders had turned Telangana into a garbage dump.

Meanwhile, the BRS president took the decision to dissolve all the party committees, with the sole exception of the BRS state committee.

He announced that party membership enrollment would be conducted through both online and offline channels. He issued directives to provide training to 200 BRS party activists in every assembly constituency.

For the BRS membership drive, a fee of ₹10 was fixed for general membership, while the fee for active membership was set at ₹50. On the occasion, the BRS party also passed a resolution demanding the procurement of all crops harvested within the state. It further called for immediate measures to implement women's reservations.
