TGCHE Organizes Vice-Chancellors' Meet with Governor and Chancellor

Calls for Teaching Leadership, Skill Development and Research Innovation

HYDERABAD

A meeting of Vice-Chancellors of Telangana State Universities was held today with the Hon'ble Governor & Chancellor at Lok Bhavan, Hyderabad, from 11:00 AM to 1:00 pm.

The Hon'ble Governor & Chancellor, in his address, appreciated the contributions of Telangana State Universities in advancing higher education and acknowledged their historic role in shaping generations of students. He noted that Telangana has achieved a Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) of around 40%, significantly higher than the national average, reflecting the State's commitment to expanding access to higher education.

Further, focus was laid on strengthening research and innovation through the establishment of specialized research centres in agriculture, horticulture, and organic seeds, while also addressing global competitiveness, talent migration, and positioning Telangana and India as leaders in knowledge and higher education.

The Chairman, TGCHE, Prof. (Dr.) V. Balakista Reddy, while welcoming the Hon'ble Governor & Chancellor and the Vice-Chancellors, presented a brief overview of the recent initiatives undertaken in the higher education sector in Telangana. He highlighted



that over the year, TGCHE has undertaken focused, outcome-oriented initiatives to strengthen the higher education ecosystem in the State. Guided by the vision of academic excellence, inclusivity, and global competitiveness, the Council has worked across key areas such as academic restructuring, institutional capacity building, skill development, and international collaboration, fostering a strong link between education and employability.

Women of Telangana raise their voice against Congress's anti-women stance

Protesting the Congress party's "cheap politics" on women's reservations, the "Women's Anger March" was successfully held in Hyderabad. Under the leadership of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), a massive "Mahila Aagraha Yatra" (Women's Protest March) was held today in Hyderabad against the alleged hypocrisy and anti-women attitude of the Congress party and the Congress-led INDIA alliance. The march began at AV College in Domalguda and continued successfully up to Indira Park, with thousands of women participating and expressing their protest against Congress.

Prominent leaders including BJP State President N. Ramchander Rao, Union Minister Kishan Reddy, Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Bandi Sanjay Kumar, Rajya Sabha MP Dr. K. Laxman, BJP National Vice President and MP DK Aruna, BJP Legislature Party Leader Aleti Maheshwar Reddy, MP Eatala Rajender, MLC Malka Komaraiah, and other leaders attended as guest guests and extended their support to women. They strongly criticized Congress for allegedly disrespecting women.

Large numbers of BJP Mahila Morcha leaders, BJYM leaders, party workers, and common women gathered and raised slogans explaining how the Congress party has, for decades, obstructed women's reservations. Throughout the

march, participants carried placards criticizing Congress's anti-women ideology. Roads from AV College to Indira Park turned saffron as women from across the twin cities joined in large numbers.

Leaders criticized that while Prime Minister Narendra Modi brought the Women's Reservation Bill, Congress has politicized and obstructed it. At the concluding protest meeting at Indira Park, women leaders delivered emotional speeches, highlighting the Modi government's initiatives for women's welfare and condemning Congress's stance. They warned that the Congress party would face consequences due to the anger of women's power.

Speaking on the occasion, women leaders said that while Prime Minister Narendra Modi courageously introduced the "Nari Shakti Vandan Adhiniyam", granting 33% reservation for women in legislatures, Congress and the INDIA alliance have a shameful history of obstructing it. They accused Congress of using the delimitation issue as an excuse to hinder women's progress.

BJP State President N. Ramchander Rao stated that both BRS and Congress are anti-women forces. He criticized that when the BRS first formed the government in Telangana, no woman was included in the cabinet, reflecting their attitude toward women. He also alleged that Congress is trying to turn the issue into a North-South political divide and

accused leaders like Rahul Gandhi and Revanth Reddy of promoting divisive politics under international influences.

He compared Congress leaders' behavior in Parliament to the Kauravas in the Mahabharata, saying that just as Draupadi was humiliated, Congress leaders allegedly celebrated when the women's bill failed. He warned that those who insult women would meet a similar fate.

He praised Prime Minister Modi for standing with women like Lord Krishna supported the Pandavas in the Mahabharata, calling it a "righteous battle" for women's justice. He assured that BJP is committed to implementing women's reservations.

Union Minister Kishan Reddy criticized Congress for neglecting women's reservations for decades despite Dr. B.R. Ambedkar recognizing their importance long ago. He called April 17 a "dark day" in history for women, alleging that Congress blocked the bill and celebrated it.

He also questioned why Congress did not conduct a caste census when in power and stated that only the NDA government under Modi is sincerely working for backward classes. He urged people to reject Congress's politics and unite for women's empowerment. He warned that leaders like Rahul Gandhi, Revanth Reddy, Stalin, Asaduddin Owaisi, and KCR would face consequences if they harm women's interests or Telangana's development.

Rajya Sabha MP Dr. K. Laxman said that the Modi government has taken historic steps to ensure women's representation without harming southern states. He stated that through constitutional amendments, women's reservations could be implemented by 2029, and delimitation would increase seats without reducing representation in southern states.

He explained that Telangana Assembly seats could increase from 119 to 179 and Parliament seats from 17 to 26, improving representation for women as well as SC/ST communities. He accused Congress of creating obstacles through baseless arguments.

MP DK Aruna stated that opposition parties are unable to accept the fair delimitation process proposed by Modi. She alleged that Congress fears losing political relevance if more women enter politics. MP Eatala Rajender praised women's contributions across all fields and highlighted their role during crises like COVID-19. He reiterated that Modi has the courage to take bold decisions and assured that women's reservations would be implemented despite opposition.

Overall, the "Women's Anger March" held in Hyderabad concluded successfully with strong protests against Congress's alleged anti-women policies. Participants warned that they would continue their fight for women's rights and hold Congress and its allies accountable.
