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Govt firmly committed to public welfare: Vivek

Minister for Labour, Employment and Mines Dr. G. Vivek Venkatswamy has reaffirmed that the Congress government in Telangana remains firmly committed to the welfare of the people and to delivering transparent, responsive and effective governance at every level.

The Minister said the Praja Palana programme, organised every week at Gandhi Bhavan, reflects the government's people-centric approach and provides a direct platform for citizens to interact with public representatives and seek redressal of their grievances.

Vivek Venkatswamy was speaking to the media after supervising the Praja Palana programme held at Gandhi Bhavan on Wednesday.

People from different sections of society met the Minister and personally submitted representations relating to various issues. Along with senior party leaders and office-bearers, the Minister received the petitions and assured the applicants that their grievances would be addressed at the earliest.

Speaking on the occasion, the Minister said that several grievances

brought to the programme were resolved on the spot, while the remaining representations were forwarded to the respective government departments and officials for necessary action.

He said the Congress government has undertaken several welfare initiatives for the benefit of the people and has already issued new ration cards to all eligible beneficiaries across the State.

The Minister described the ration card as a key document that enables access to several welfare schemes, including the Indiramma Housing

Scheme and other government benefits. "The weekly Praja Palana programme at Gandhi Bhavan provides an effective platform to identify such issues and ensure that they are resolved in a timely and transparent manner," the Minister said.

During the programme, Vivek Venkatswamy received around 120 representations, covering issues related to employment, pensions, Indiramma housing, land disputes and other public grievances. He directed the concerned officials to examine the petitions on priority and take prompt action for their resolution.

Mastering HR Interview Questions Session Equips GITAM Students for Placements

The Training, Mentoring & Career Guidance (TMCG) Centre, under the GITAM Career Guidance Centre, organised an online career readiness session titled "Mastering HR Interview Questions" for the 2027 graduating batch of GITAM Deemed to be University on 8 July 2026. The session was led by Dr. Rojeena Mathew, Director, TMCG.

Addressing the participants, Dr. Mathew emphasised that succeeding in an HR interview is not about delivering perfect answers but about responding with clarity, confidence, and purpose. She noted that while a strong résumé may secure an interview opportunity, the HR round often determines whether



a candidate receives the final job offer.

The interactive session focused on helping students understand what recruiters genuinely look for during HR interviews. It covered effective

self-introductions, strategies for answering commonly asked questions on strengths, weaknesses, achievements, and career goals, techniques to communicate with confidence, and common mistakes that can

adversely affect interview performance. Dr. Mathew encouraged students to present their authentic selves, articulate their aspirations effectively, and approach interviews with confidence. She reiterated that technical expertise opens the door to opportunities, while communication skills and the right attitude help candidates secure them.

The session concluded with an engaging question-and-answer interaction, during which students clarified their doubts and gained practical insights into the recruitment process. Participants appreciated the programme for enhancing their interview preparedness and strengthening their confidence for upcoming campus placements.

Behind the Uniform: The Hidden Dangers Faced by City Sanitation Workers

Two GHMC sanitation workers were injured on Wednesday morning after an auto trolley allegedly hit them while trying to overtake a bus near IDPL Gate, Balanagar. The incident underscores growing concerns about the safety of frontline sanitation staff navigating busy city roads. The

injured workers, identified as Anita and Bhaskar, were immediately assisted by their colleagues and rushed to a nearby hospital. Police were alerted, and DE (Sanitation) Shankar Nayak, AE Vaishnavi, and SS Niranjan Rao, along with Balanagar police constable Ravinder, reached the accident site promptly. They later visited the hospital, assuring the victims

of proper medical care while launching the necessary investigations.

In a candid conversation with reporters, GHMC Assistant Engineer (Sanitation) Vaishnavi voiced deep concern over the rising number of accidents involving sanitation workers. She pointed out that reckless driving and traffic violations pose a persistent

threat to workers who perform their duties on bustling roads. Even though workers wear high-visibility safety jackets, they remain vulnerable to speeding vehicles that drivers fail to manage with caution.

GHMC officials stressed the urgent need for stricter enforcement of traffic rules and greater public awareness to safeguard frontline sanitation workers. The incident serves as a sobering reminder that those who keep our city clean deserve safer conditions, respect, and accountability from all road users.

The community and city authorities are urging drivers to exercise heightened caution, particularly around sanitation personnel who are conducting essential public health and cleanliness duties. Plans for enhanced safety measures, including intensified traffic monitoring near busy zones and ongoing safety training for workers, are being considered to prevent future tragedies and protect those who serve the city daily.

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
