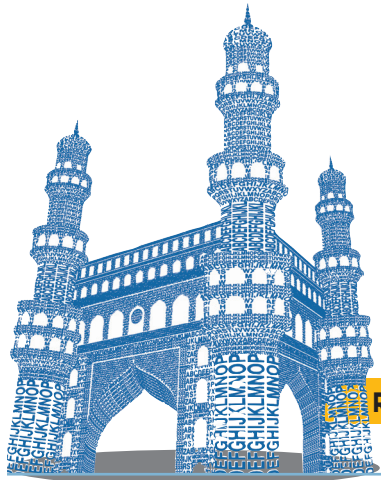

CM Revanth Reddy Addressed a public meeting after releasing Rythu Bharosa in Hyderabad today

Hyderabad , June 30: Chief Minister Shri A Revanth Reddy has announced that the state government would deposit Rs 9000 crore in the farmers accounts in 9 days under the Rythu Bharosa scheme . In view of prevailing drought conditions due to deficit rainfall, the Chief minister appealed to the farmers to cultivate high yielding 7 paddy varieties prescribed by the state government in the difficult conditions.

Addressing a public meeting after releasing Rythu Bharosa funds in the farmers accounts today, the CM said adequate funds are made available for Rythu Bharosa and also fine variety paddy seeds at 'Rythu Vedikas' (farm-



ers' platforms).

The Chief minister exposed the misdeeds committed by the last government and explained the welfare of the farmers in the last 30 months . The People's government waived ₹20,000 crores of loans of 25.35 lakh farmers. Immediately upon assuming office, we paid ₹7,000 crore under the 'Rythu Bharosa' scheme and also cleared the outstanding dues left by the previous administration at the Civil Supplies Corporation in 2023. We increased the 'Rythu Bharosa' amount to ₹12,000 and have deposited ₹27,000 crore into farmers' accounts so far. In all, we paid a total of ₹36,000 crore under 'Rythu Bharosa'.

So far, we have spent ₹1,75,000 crore for farmers. We have been spending ₹6,000 crore per month for farmers welfare. The previous BRS government spent only Rs 2000 per month.

Further, CM Revanth Reddy claimed it was the Congress that pioneered free power supply to the farmers. Free electricity is the Congress party's signature initiative. Farmer CM of the erstwhile AP Y.S. Rajasekhara Reddy signed orders to waive electricity arrears alongside implementing free electricity on the day of his assuming CM office. The Chief minister took strong exception to the BRS statement on the free power supply.

KTR: ₹30,000 Cr in Rythu Bharosa Dues Denied to Farmers

HYDERABAD, JUNE 30

BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) strongly criticized Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, accusing him of betraying Telangana's farming community by withholding nearly ₹30,000 crore under the Rythu Bharosa scheme. KTR said the Chief Minister's so-called "Ashirvada Sabhas" are nothing but a political drama aimed at diverting public attention from the severe urea shortage and the hardships faced by farmers across the State.

KTR said that releasing Rythu Bharosa assistance merely requires the government to transfer funds directly into farmers' accounts, yet the Congress government has chosen to organise extravagant public meetings purely for publicity. While farmers are struggling with procurement



issues, shortage of urea and the looming threat of drought, the Chief Minister is busy conducting celebratory events instead of addressing their problems, he said.

Describing the Congress government's 30-month rule as a "disastrous administration," KTR alleged that it has turned agriculture into a crisis and denied farmers

The state government had issued orders on June 26 appointing Jaju to the top administrative post following his repatriation from Central services. Upon taking charge, Jaju was warmly welcomed at the Secretariat, where Special Chief Secretaries, Principal Secretaries, Secretaries, and various heads of departments congratulated him on his new role. The officials and Secretariat staff also presented bouquets to the outgoing Chief Secretary, K. Ramakrishna Rao, honouring his service. Ramakrishna Rao has been appointed as an Advisor and Ex-Officio Special Chief Secretary to the Chief Minister

UTTAM INVITES GLOBAL AEROSPACE FIRMS TO TELANGANA HUB

HYDERABAD, JUNE 30

Telangana Minister for Irrigation and Civil Supplies and former Indian Air Force fighter pilot Capt. N. Uttam Kumar Reddy has invited global aerospace and defence companies to establish manufacturing facilities in Telangana, while announcing plans to develop new airfields at Warangal, Adilabad and Kothagudem to strengthen the State's aviation infrastructure.

Speaking at the inauguration of Aeromart Hyderabad 2026, Uttam Kumar Reddy said Telangana has emerged as one of the world's fastest-growing aerospace manufacturing destinations, backed by investor-friendly policies, world-class infrastructure, skilled



manpower and a robust industrial ecosystem.

Addressing delegates from over 25 countries, including global aerospace manufacturers, defence firms, OEMs, diplomats and industry leaders, the Minister said, "The future of global aerospace collaboration is taking shape right here in Telangana."

Recalling his service as a fighter pilot in the Indian Air Force, where he flew aircraft such as the MiG-21, MiG-23 and Mirage-2000, Uttam Kumar Reddy said his aviation experience had given him a deep appreciation for precision engineering and the critical standards required in the aerospace industry.

Highlighting Telangana's growing global presence, he said the State is manufacturing key aerospace components for leading international companies. These include cabins for the US Presidential helicopter by Tata Sikorsky Aerospace, fuselages for Boeing's Apache helicopters, wings for Lockheed Martin's F-16 fighter aircraft and aero-engine components produced by Safran, GE Aerospace and Honeywell.

The Minister said Telangana recently laid the foundation stone for Spain-based ITP Aero's first manufacturing facility in India and inaugurated Canadian company FTG Aerospace's manufacturing unit at GMR Aerospace Park. The strong participation of

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GHMC REVISES FLYOVER ROUTE AFTER RESIDENTS' APPEAL

Dr. Kota Neelima Hails People-Centric Decision

Hyderabad, June 30: In a major relief to residents of Pattigadda Colony, the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation has revised the proposed alignment of the Pattigadda-Rasoolpura Junction Flyover following concerns raised by local families over possible displacement and damage to heritage structures.

TPCC Vice President and Congress Party In-charge for the Sanathnagar Assembly Constituency, Dr. Kota Neelima, welcomed the decision and thanked GHMC Commissioner R.V. Karnan for responding positively to the representations submitted by residents.

Dr. Neelima met the Commissioner



and personally expressed her gratitude for revisiting the project design in a manner that reduces inconvenience to the public and protects families from displacement. She said the revised alignment reflects the administration's willingness to listen to citizens and incorporate their concerns into infrastructure planning.

Speaking to the media, Dr. Neelima recalled that she had earlier met the GHMC Commissioner along with Pattigadda residents and submitted a formal representation seeking a review of the original flyover alignment. According to her, the earlier proposal was likely to affect nearly 40 houses, displace hundreds of residents, and pose a threat to

several heritage and historically significant structures in the area.

Residents had also prepared an alternative alignment proposal and submitted it to the authorities for examination. Dr. Neelima welcomed the government's decision to take those suggestions into account, describing it as a strong example of inclusive, responsive, and people-centric governance.

She extended her thanks to Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, GHMC Commissioner R.V. Karnan, and the concerned officials for their timely intervention and commitment to protecting public interests.

Dr. Neelima said the decision proves that development and public welfare can go hand in hand. She added that the Congress Government has shown that major infrastructure projects can be implemented without ignoring the concerns, homes, and livelihoods of ordinary citizens.

28-Year-Old Dies by Suicide After Domestic Dispute in Harijan Basti

MEDCHAL-MALKAJGIRI, JUNE 30

A 28-year-old man from Harijan Basti, within the Balanagar police limits, died by suicide Tuesday morning after a domestic dispute fueled by chronic alcohol use. Tekmalla Srikanth, a private sector employee, lived with his wife Yamini and their four-year-old son. Srikanth returned home intoxicated Monday night and argued with his wife and his aunt. The quarrel escalated after the aunt admonished him for his habitual drinking. The couple's wife and aunt chose to sleep in an adjacent room to avoid further conflict.

Around 6:30 AM on Tuesday, family members found Srikanth hanging from a ceiling fan. Local residents helped bring him down and he was rushed to a nearby hospital, but doctors pro-



nounced him dead on arrival. A formal complaint was filed by Yamini, and the Balanagar police launched an inquiry. Officials say the case appears rooted in ongoing family disputes tied to Srikanth's chronic alcohol consumption.

Balanagar Inspector Narasimha Raju emphasized that domestic tensions and alcohol dependence appear to be the primary factors driving this tragedy, and investigators are continuing to gather details from neighbors and relatives. Srikanth's wife Yamini

and their four-year-old son are left to cope with the loss, while relatives urge a review of alcohol-related distress and family support systems in the area. Harijan Basti has seen several incidents in recent years where alcohol-related conflicts have escalated into serious confrontations, highlighting the need for community awareness and support services.

Police will complete routine post-mortem investigation procedures, collect statements, and review any surveillance or witness accounts to determine if there were additional contributing factors. Suicide remains a sensitive and complex issue; authorities urge families facing alcohol-related stress to seek help from counseling services and local support networks to prevent similar tragedies.

nearly ₹30,000 crore under the Rythu Bharosa scheme during the last two-and-a-half years. He said the Congress had promised ₹15,000 per acre annually before the elections but, after assuming office, released assistance only for one or two acres while denying benefits to lakhs of farmers.

KTR alleged that the Congress government has failed to honour Rythu Bharosa on four occasions, affecting nearly 70 lakh farmers across Telangana. He said farmers would never forget what he described as the government's betrayal. He further accused the government of failing to fulfil its promise of a ₹2 lakh farm loan waiver, alleging that it had not even implemented a quarter of the promised waiver.

He also criticised the government for spending crores of rupees on the Chief Minis-

ter's repeated visits to Delhi and publicity-oriented public meetings instead of extending investment support to farmers.

Recalling the BRS government's tenure, KTR said agriculture flourished during the previous ten years under the leadership of K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR). He stated that KCR had credited nearly ₹73,000 crore directly into farmers' bank accounts through 11 timely instalments of Rythu Bandhu, laying the foundation for an agricultural transformation in Telangana.

KTR asserted that KCR would forever be remembered as a "Farmer's Benefactor," whereas Revanth Reddy would be remembered as a "Betrayal of Farmers." He warned that the Congress government's alleged betrayal of Telangana's farmers would continue to haunt it politically.

The CM warned that women will beat the BRS leaders with brooms for claiming "free electricity is theirs" . SO far, the government spent Rs 30,000 on free power supply, Rs ₹4,000 crore on the bonus for fine-variety paddy and Rs ₹3,500 crore on farmer insurance.

The Chief minister challenged the BRS for a special Assembly session on farmers issues and debated what the last government achieved in 10 years and the present government accomplished in two and a half years. Since assuming the office on December 7, 2023, the government has been making every effort to transform agriculture into a celebration and ensure farmers live with self-respect.

CM Revanth Reddy took a broadside at KCR regime for leaving the financially flourishing Telangana into a debt ridden state . The total debt incurred by Telangana—accumulated from the tenures of leaders - Prakasam Pantulu, Bezawada Gopala Reddy, and Burgula Ramakrishna Rao to Kiran Kumar Reddy—was only at ₹69,000 crore. When Telangana was formed on June 2, 2014, the outstanding debt stood at only ₹69,000 crore. The state debt reached Rs 8,11,000 crore by the time the people's government was sworn in on December 7, 2023. "The KCR family alone incurred a debt of over ₹7 lakh crore, plunging the state deep into a debt trap", the Chief minister charged. After the congress came to power, we unearthed massive debts through borrowings from every source by the previous government . The state was left in a pathetic condition where the government employees' salaries were paid in installments during the BRS rule. Now, the Congress government was paying salaries promptly despite facing financial challenges.

The Chief minister castigated the KCR government for not paying dues of the school children's uniforms and other bills. Hundreds of crores in dues were owed to Sarpanches and



some of them committed suicide. Sarpanches, MPTCs, and ZPTCs staged protests. " We cannot simply wear a sherwani and call ourselves Nawabs. We are not Nawabs. We are paupers". Payments were not made to the women of self-help groups who cooked meals for school children. Mess charges and cosmetic allowances were not provided to students living in hostels. We restored dignity in society and are steering a devastated Telangana towards progress, the CM remarked.

Continuing the tirade against KCR , CM Revanth Reddy said the last government failed to waive farm loans up to ₹1 lakh , not provided three acres of land to Dalits and no irrigation facility to one crore acres. Despite spending ₹1.02 lakh crore on Kaleshwaram, it collapsed within two years, turning into 'Kuleshwaram' (a ruined structure) . Even without a single drop of water from Kaleshwaram over three years, Telangana farmers produced 2.8 crore metric tonnes of paddy .

KCR also destroyed existing cultures and fostered a culture of alcoholism. While we introduced 'Rythu Bazaars' (farmers' markets), KCR introduced 'Belt Shops' (illegal liquor outlets). KCR has turned even the children into drunkards, the CM said, appealing to KCR to stop spinning tall claims . The people of Telangana already relegated KCR to the farmhouse. No one wanted KCR to return to power. The CM stated that the previous BRS left behind arrears amounting to ₹8,000 crore owed to retired employees. Under the Congress rule, the RTC has turned a profit of ₹1,000 crore and also brought Singareni into profitability. We are also resolving issues by scrapping 'Dharani' and introducing 'Bhu-Bharathi'.

The CM warned that , If KCR returns to power, the BRS leader will do nothing but listen to the private conversations between husbands and wives. One should be ashamed to listen in on the conversations between a husband and wife. Evan KCR's own daughter mentioned

hearing her parents' private conversations. It seems the Kalvakuntla family is under a curse where telling a single truth would cause their heads to shatter into a thousand pieces. " I have already detained Pashupati in the farm house like the demon in the movie Arundhati".

The chief Minister took a strong dig at BJP national President Nithin Nabi's comments that the BJP will come to power in Telangana in the next elections. PM Modi promised to deposit ₹15 lakhs into every poor person's account and pledged to provide 2 crore jobs annually. 24 crore jobs should have been created. Did that happen? In Telangana, [the BJP] gave positions only to Bandi Sanjay and Kishan Reddy.

CM Revanth Reddy took a swipe at the BRS leaders for demanding resignation and dissolving the government. " This government is not a ' Gadi Palana or Dora's property' to resign" , the Chief minister said that he will not run a government built on a foundation of lies. The Musi rejuvenation project , Regional Ring roads and Metro Rail expansion would be taken up against all odds created by the opposition.

The CM highlighted that his government was providing free bus travel for women on RTC buses and paid ₹11,000 crore to the RTC so far. Women's groups were made the owners of 1,000 buses, facilitated to set up 1,000-megawatt solar plants by women's self-help groups and also petrol bunks capable of competing with Reliance. Allocated land worth ₹1,000 crore at Shilparamam for stalls run by women's self-help groups. We have provided 70,000 jobs in the last 30 months. The CM questioned the BRS for opposing the notification to fill 5000 posts in the police department. " I have no desire to wear crowns or amass vast wealth and jewels, power is not permanent", the Chief minister said that quality 'Bathukamma' sarees were provided . It is the farmers' responsibility to safeguard this government, the CM said.

French and Italian firms at Aeromart Hyderabad 2026 reflected the State's increasing global appeal, he added.

He noted that Telangana has built one of India's strongest aerospace ecosystems with dedicated aerospace Special Economic Zones, precision engineering parks and more than 1,500 MSMEs supplying components to the aerospace, defence and space sectors. Initiatives such as the Young India Skills University and the transformation of Industrial Training Institutes into Advanced Technology Centres are helping create a skilled workforce for the industry, he said.

Uttam Kumar Reddy said Telangana's aerospace and defence sector has recorded nearly 30 per cent annual growth

in recent years, while exports from the sector surged by 103 per cent during the previous year, overtaking pharmaceutical exports for the first time.

Announcing major aviation infrastructure projects, the Minister said work on the proposed Warangal airport is expected to commence next month. He also announced plans for a combined civil and military airport at Adilabad and said discussions with the Centre for establishing an airport at Kothagudem were in the final stages.

He said the new airports would create significant opportunities for Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO) operations and other aviation-related industries by offering lower operational costs than major metropolitan airports.
